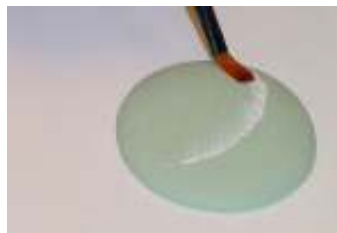




Decorative Art Paste

*Instructions and examples
of how to use this exciting
new product.*

The Ginger jar on the right shows one way to use Decorative Art Paste. The strawberries are done on a Mint Green porcelain blank. You may apply the pattern with any graphite paper and a ball stylus, although the white is best because the black can often times tint the paste itself. Once your pattern has been applied you can begin to paste. You can either use the paste directly from the bottle or you can squeeze the contents into a cake decorating bag and use regular cake decorating tips. Decorative Art Paste can be applied to wood, fabric, tin, ceramics, porcelain or even etched glass.



You can see in the photo above left the way you use the paste directly from the bottle. Once you apply the paste be sure and twist the top of the bottle onto a damp sponge to keep the tip moist and unclogged. Next use the brush of your choice (we use filberts or water clean brushes). Slightly dampen the brush and push onto the paste while pulling towards yourself. In this way you can create the lacy edge to a leaf quite easily and can paste your entire pattern. On the right you can see the strawberry close up. The berries were built up in several stages and smoothed with a wet brush. Once dry they were sanded and the seeds and calyx were added with a cake decorating tip. Once you are finished pasting your pattern you can paint it with any acrylic or oil based paint. We used PLAID acrylics. Once dry you can use a brush on gloss sealer to seal the berries. The parts you want to leave matte can be left unsealed or you may seal them with a brush on matte sealer.



Decorative Art Paste also comes in various colors. Currently there are five pastel colors and five deep colors. The pastel colors in Light Blue, Light Pink and Light Yellow were used on the fired decal on the left. On the stem we used the ever popular Gold Paste to accent the branches.

On the right you can see two photos. The one on the top shows the application of the Light Lavender on top of a fired decal of purple pansies. The one on the bottom shows a close up of the vase on the left so that you can see the paste better.

Always be sure and clean your brushes and tips with mild soap and water immediately after using so that the paste doesn't dry on them. Decorative Art Paste can be thinned with water when necessary and can be tinted with any acrylic color if you want to make your own colors. Items decorated with Decorative Art Paste are cleanable with a damp cloth and mild soap and water.
